This red-hot project is also getting support from renowned leaders in ice hockey, including hockey coach and philanthropist Larry Robbins and NHL's "The Great One" Wayne Gretzky.

Gretzky plans to host the "Gretzky Hockey School" at the new ice rink. Founded in 2014 by he and his son Ty Gretzky, it's one of the premier hockey schools in the world.

"Together with my son, we're honored to expand the reach of our hockey school to more residents in Palm Beach County," said Gretzky. "Hockey has the power to unite communities, and we are thrilled to be a part of bringing that unity to even more people to cultivate a new era of hockey enthusiasts."

Gretzky played 20 seasons in the National Hockey League from 1979 to 1999 and has been widely named the greatest ice hockey player of all time by sports writers, players, and the NHL. To this day, Gretzky holds the record for most career goals, assists, and points scored in NHL history and is in the Hockey Hall of

Robbins is CEO of Glenview Capital Management and a passionate hockey enthusiast. He was a player and captain at the University of Pennsylvania. For 18 years, he coached youth hockey in New Jersey and for eight years, he owned the Chicago Steel, a powerhouse in junior hockey.
